

### **School Policy**

### Personal mobile phone and electronic devices

In accordance with the Education Department's Mobile Phones Policy, personal mobile phones and personal electronic devices **must not** be used at NPSC during school hours. Students who used their personal mobile phones or personal electronic devices inappropriately during school hours will be asked to hand their phone to the staff member and it will be locked securely in the front office. The parent or guardian will be contacted to collect the phone at their earliest opportunity.

#### **Attendance**

All International Students must satisfy their visa conditions in order to maintain their fulltime studies within Australia.

These conditions include:

- All International students must have an <u>attendance rate of 90%</u> as per Noble Park Secondary College Attendance Policy as well as ensuring students attend all classes on time.
- Must complete all set tasks, including homework and assessment tasks.
- Must comply with College and classroom rules.

Student's attendance will be monitored regularly. When the student is late to school or is absent without a proper reason, there will be detention afterschool given by the Year Level Coordinator.

<u>IMPORTANT NOTE:</u> When students' attendance rate is **less than 90%**, the student will be placed on a contract to improve their attendance, as well as the attendance procedure template will be completed.

#### **Course Progress**

All International Students must pass or demonstrate competency in at least 50 per cent of the course requirements for a study period (i.e. a semester). The International Students must successfully complete sufficient units of study to enable completion within the approved Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE) duration in each study period (i.e. semester). E.g. for Year 11 and 12 students satisfactorily complete sufficient units to achieve a VCE/VCAL qualification.

IMPORTANT NOTE: When student has more than one subject with unsatisfactory progress, a meeting with the International Student Coordinator and the Leading Teacher will meet with the student. When there are more than one subject with unsatisfactory progress, the student will be placed on a Course Progress Contract with regular monitoring.

### **College Uniform**

All students from Year 7 to Year 12 are required to wear the Noble Park Secondary College uniform in a neat, tidy and well-groomed manner. Please refer to **NPSC Uniform Code Agreement**.

When students are not in the correct uniform, they **MUST** go to their Year Level Coordinator for a uniform pass. Students without correct uniform may be sent home to change, or be removed from any school programs for the day.

### Reports - Continuous Reporting

NPSC has moved to CONTINUOUS REPORTING in 2022 for Years 7-12. Continuous reporting refers to the process of teachers providing timely and targeted feedback to students about their learning progress in a subject. This is done through Compass and the feedback and assessment information is then made visible to students and parents.

### **Careers Counselling**

The college Careers Coordinator, Ms Schiavello will provide you with the information and material for the next stage of your education.

After completing the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE), you can continue your studies at a Victorian University or a Training and Further Education Institute (TAFE). You can apply through VTAC, the Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre, just like local students. The Careers Coordinator will run sessions towards the end of Year 12, to help you complete the VTAC application and tertiary entrance.

The careers teacher with provide you with:

- Ongoing careers counselling and advice
- Assistance with all types of applications for tertiary institutions
- Further counselling, assistance and adjustment of course preferences when your VCE results become available

The International Student Program Coordinator will work with the Careers Coordinator to make sure the international students have the support and information and to prepare them for their life outside the college community.

#### **Doctors @ School**








### **Access to Public Libraries**

#### Child Safe
