Accessibility Grant

We have had personnel from "Foursight Architects" visit our College to investigate adjustments that will increase accessibility for students who are in wheelchair's. Currently they have submitted architect plans and surveyors have been completing required inspections. Once these have been priced and finalised, the V.S.B.A (Victorian School Building Authority) will send the project our to tender.

The V.S.B.A. will manage the project with the successful tenderer. It is anticipated that this project will commence in 2024, with some works to be completed during school holiday breaks.

- Area 1: Drama Remove existing stage and partition wall, install new stage and ramp
- Area 2: decking between C and E Block, new covered walkway to D Block Senior Centre

Decking from Library and B Block to join with new corridor decking, all one level

- Area 3: Cleaner Cupboard D Block converted to unisex disabled toilet.
- Area 4: Small ramp at rear D Block Senior Centre. Ramp to top basketball court (replaced existing gravel)
- **Area 5:** Ramp and decking to basketball court near Gym. Install gate in section of chain link fence. Ramp extends along the side of the Gym, joining with rear porch near boys change rooms
- Area 6: New front door to Gym/Hall, new ramp to front of Gym/Hall
- Area 7: Convert Gym Store Room into unisex disabled toilet. Room near girls toilets.
- Area 8: Gym/Hall new access door to under stage. Portable lift for Stage
- Area 9: D Block Senior Centre convert Male Toilets converted to Upgraded Mail Toilets and Cleaners Store

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IELP Botanic Gardens Excursion

On the 3rd of November, our IELP class went to the magnificent Royal Botanic Gardens to learn about some Australian native plants.

In the morning, we arrived at the Royal Botanic Gardens by train. We had an Aboriginal guide to introduce different plants species to us. When we entered the gardens, the first thing we saw were trees. The guide allowed us to take a piece of leaf from a tee tree so that we could smell it. We were told that Aboriginal could extract oil from this tree and use it as a germ killer and an herbal medicine.

Next, we headed to another tree which seemed like a lemon tree. The guide handed us a piece of leaf to smell again, and he then explained what it was used for. Then, we walked again to see the oldest tree in the gardens and took some group photos together. It was really fun. After that, the guide led us to sit on grass, and then started to introduce some ancient tools that Aboriginal people used for hunting animals, such as boomerangs and axes.







After that, we continued to explore the gardens. We reached another plant with long, sharp leaves, which are used for calling for help when you see snakes or in danger. The guide gave us one leaf each so that we could try to make the flute-like sound. Some students could make the high-pitched sound, but I couldn't. The next thing we did after that was just walking around and discovering new plants and trees. After a while, we reached the entry gate of the gardens, that was the end of our journey in the Botanic Gardens.

The last thing for the day was to cross Sandridge Bridge and get to know the immigration statistics from various countries, then we went home.

In conclusion, I had a very nice time at the Botanic Gardens, so I would recommend other people go and visit it with friends or family, and you will have a relaxing time exploring new species of plants and trees.






