As part of the program, students will engage in an exciting research project focused on a chosen musical instrument. This project will enable them to explore the instrument's history, construction and playing techniques.










Book Week

Morrisby Program

Year 9 students started their journey on the My Career Insights, Morrisby program. Morrisby is a career assessment tool designed for students in year 9 to discover possible career paths, develop an awareness of the array of careers in society and assist them to drive their career planning, giving them the confidence to start mapping out their future. Morrisby is a vital tool when choosing senior subjects that can give them the foundational knowledge and skills to work toward their future study or work goals.

The Morrisby program is presented in 2 stages. The first stage is online profiling, the second stage is a 1:1 consultation with a trained Morrisby consultant, to unpack their profiling results and investigate suggested careers.

Year 9 students participated in profiling during Term 2. The profiling involves students completing a series of online aptitude, interest, and personality questions. During Term 3 Year 9 students will have the opportunity to have a 1:1 consultation with a trained Morrisby advisor to discuss the profiling results, investigate subject options, and explore suggested occupations, based on their results. These consultations will take place at school in the Frances Ho Centre and will be indicated on the students' Compass.

The University of Melbourne - Class of 1976 **Scholarship**

The University of Melbourne offers a 'Class of 1976 Scholarship' to Noble Park Secondary College students.

This Scholarship provides an allowance of \$18,000 per year for 3 years to the successful student from our College. This allowance is made by an anonymous benefactor who once attended Noble Park Secondary College and then studied at The University of Melbourne.

You do not need to submit an application for this scholarship. All students from Noble Park Secondary College who have applied to The University of Melbourne via VTAC will automatically be considered.

Karley is completing the VCE vocational major Cert 2 in Animal Studies at Foundation Learning Centre. This is Karley's first year of her vet studies and she will continue completing her Cert 2 next year along with her Year 12 certificate.

Karley is currently completing her structured workplace learning placement at Chesterfield Farm in Ferntree Gully. Her time has seen her participating in activities and as you can see by the photo, Karley has many animals to work with. This is good practise for Karley's goal to work with animals in the future. **There is a video of her SWL on our College YouTube Channel.**

Please keep in mind:

SWL is a core component of the VCE VM. Every student is required to have a SWL placement directly aligning to their VET studies. If a student has not yet secured a placement, they are expected to attend school on either Wednesday or Fridays. During this time students can research SWL opportunities, contact potential employers and complete any outstanding VET or class work. If students cannot attend their SWL due to unforseen circumstances the employer and our Careers Team MUST be contacted by phone call. NOT SMS.

Attendance at VET is essential for a successful outcome of the VCE Vocational Major and to gain a VET Certificate. If a student is going to arrive late or is unable to attend either their VET or SWL, they must inform the Careers Team directly on 9546 9136 and a parent/guardian approval must be entered on Compass. Absences without approval will be considered truancy. Failure to meet the minimum required hours for VET may result in a 'not satisfactory' result, compromising VCE VM and a VET certificate.




