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## NOBLE PARK SECONDARY <br> UNIFORM CODE AGREEMENT

Last revised 22-2-2019
All students and parents are expected to read and sign this agreement as a condition of enrolment at Noble Park Secondary College.
The Uniform Code for Noble Park Secondary College has been designed to:

- develop a sense of pride in the students of the College, and to promote the College ethos.
- enhance the safety of students through the easy identification of persons not belonging to the College who are on College premises.
- promote equality among students through common dress.
- ensure the safe management of student groups in out-of-College activities.


## UNIFORM CODE:

- All students at Noble Park Secondary College will wear the specified uniform, when travelling to, when at, when travelling from the College, and when attending out-of-College activities, at all times unless otherwise directed by the Administration.
- This Uniform Code provides for the provision of uniform from suppliers authorised by the College Council.

## COMPULSORY SPORT /PHYSICAL EDUCATION UNIFORM

SPORT UNIFORM NOT TO BE WORN TO AND FROM SCHOOL (unless otherwise specified by the Principal)
GIRLS AND BOYS
SPORTS TOP: Micro mesh short sleeve sports top with College logo OR Micro mesh long sleeve sports top with College logo.
SHORTS: Micro mesh basketball shorts with College initials.
PANTS: Plain Black Tracksuit Pants OR Plain College Black Sports Pants
SPORTS LEGGINGS: Optional. Plain Black sports leggings can be worn under the Micro mesh shorts
SPECIALISED PROGRAMS: Specialised program uniforms which include Council approved Football Program, to be worn only at specific times when participating in those events.

Note: It is compulsory for students to wear College Sports uniform (with logo) to any internal or external sports event.

## STEPS IN REINFORCEMENT -

Students out of uniform, should see the Year Level Coordinator (YLC) before Period 1 for a uniform pass
Step 1. Teachers checks uniform at the beginning of the lesson - logs students without a pass on Compass.
Step 2. The Year Level Coordinator (YLC) will issue a uniform pass for a maximum of one day (unless there are extenuating circumstances), to all such students. Students completely out of uniform may be sent home to change, or be removed from any school programs for the day.
Step 3. The YLC will issue an after school detention if a student does not have a reasonable excuse or note from home.
Step 4. Students who are deemed by the YLC to be persistent offenders shall be required to attend a supportive interview with their parent or guardian and the YLC after consultation with the Student Welfare Coordinator.
Step 5. No students who are out of uniform, may attend an out-of-college activity, as this reduces the teacher's ability to safely manage the students - unless the event is an 'out of uniform event' OR the student has an exemption (see below)
Step 6. Persistent offenders or students without a uniform pass may be excluded from participating in College activities and may be supervised in a classroom. No student in incorrect uniform shall be permitted for this reason, to take part in any presentation on the stage in an assembly.
Step 7. Persistent offenders or students without a uniform pass shall not be permitted to participate in any situation where they are role models i.e. Peer Support Leaders, SRC activities etc as these are occasions where students are expected to set an example to other students and to the community.

## EXEMPTIONS

Exemptions from wearing items of uniform will be considered on a case-by-case basis.
Procedures for exemption:

1. A parent or guardian will inform the Leading Teacher or YLC for that year level of the reasons for seeking an exemption.
2. The Leading Teacher will liaise with the Principal or Assistant Principal and then negotiate a suitable modification with the parent or guardian.
3. The Principal or Assistant Principal will advise the parent or guardian in writing of the exemption.
4. The Leading Teacher will issue a Uniform Pass and COMPASS notice detailing the exemptions for a suitable duration for those item(s) for the student

GENERAL APPEARANCE

| OTHER ITEMS | Other items not-listed in the uniform code are not to be worn |
| :---: | :---: |
| APPEARANCE: | The College uniform is to be worn in an appropriate manner at all times. It should be clean and in good repair. Ties should be knotted at the collar. |
| JEWELLERY: | If a student has pierced ears, studs or sleepers may be worn. Sleepers must be less than 1 cm in diameter. NO other jewellery other than a watch is to be worn, apart from religious necklaces, which must be worn under the uniform. If other jewellery is worn it will be temporarily confiscated. |
| MAKE-UP: | Make-up must not be worn. Nail polish, other than clear, must not be worn. |
| SHIRTS: | Winter shirts are to be tucked in at all times, and are to be buttoned up at all times. |
| SKIRTS \& DRE | Skirts and dresses to be worn no shorter than 10 cm above the knee. |
| HAIR: | Must be clean and neatly groomed. Must be tied back when student is working in areas where safety procedures and hygiene rules must be adhered to. No jewellery or other adornment is to be worn in the hair. No extreme hair colours or styles are permitted. |
| HATS: | Students may wear the College cap for protection from the sun, available from the uniform supplier. Labelled or multi-coloured baseball caps are not acceptable. Beanies are not permitted. |
